In addition to classical titles, the Music Media Center's CD collection includes genres ranging from rock, to country, to rap. Our CDs, DVDs, VHS, and other media can be viewed in the Media Center or checked out by any member of the Duke community (students can have them for 1 week).

## Criterion Collection DVDs

Lilly Library has begun receiving the Criterion Collection on DVD on a subscription basis. Using the latest technology and careful scholarship, Criterion has produced definitive DVD editions of artistically and historically important films. We will, when possible, also purchase previously released Criterion titles. This policy will provide a solid foundation as we develop our DVD collection.

## Staff Notes

There are several recent changes at Lilly Library to report. **Kelley Lawton** has returned to work at Lilly on a part-time basis following her recent automobile accident. **Dave Munden** is now officially Lilly's evening librarian. Last year he filled this spot at a staff position level. **Carson Holloway** has been appointed as reference and instruction librarian on a permanent basis. Carson splits his time between Lilly and Perkins. He also selects materials for the Duke University Libraries collection of military history and technology. **Danette Pachtner** has been extended for one year as the film and video librarian at Lilly. The Lilly reference interns for this year are **Maureen Barry** and **Rosalyn Metz**.

### Location Change for 16mm Film Collection

Lilly's 16mm film collection of about 500 titles has been moved off-site to the Library Service Center (LSC) where the films will be shelved in a climate-controlled environment, extending their life for future research. If you need access to any of these films, submit the request form that is available on Lilly's website and allow two or three days for delivery.

### Lilly Training Room Equipment Upgraded

A new projector and sound system have been installed in Lilly's Training Room. Equipment in the room now includes a code-free DVD player, international VCR, and cable TV. The Training Room is available for film showings for classes and group viewings.

### Plasma Screen in the Music Media Center

The Music Media Center has a large plasma screen that can be used for group viewings (up to four people) of Music DVDs and VHS tapes with headphones. Larger groups that would like to use the plasma screen with the wall speakers should contact Kirstin Dougan.

### Cowboy Music Display

The Music Library is featuring cowboy music and its history in a display of books, recordings, and videos that are on view near the circulation desk. More items on the subject can be located by searching the library catalog for "cowboy music" or particular performers or groups.
