Three Candidates to Be Selected for Final Vote at

Nominations for student government offices again show the unusual circumstances of presenting only two candidates as aspirants to the presidency. Petitions for Mary B. Mathews and for Love, Holland were submitted for that office. Until last year, when Paula Bassett and Walton Bowen were the only presidential nominees, there had been no similar situation for many years.

The total number of candidates for the two offices of president and vice lacks two of equal last year's number. There are in all 113 girls running for the nineteen offices, while the total number of officers were 123. Sophomore representatives again claim the largest group of candidates, with 45, while 35 were petitioned to run for that office. In 1936 the same group included 24 candidates.

Girls running for the various offices will be personally interviewed by individual members of the faculty, including the president, on Friday, March 17, the day following the last of the examinations. They will be required to take a three-hour written examination. An oral examination given by the examining board, will be given on March 18.
