Amendments Designed To Destroy Combines To Be Voted On

Amendments to the present constitution, giving substantial voting to every undergraduate student of the Duke, will be presented to the Student Body for vote at a constitutional convention called for general assembly Thursday morning, May 4, in Page auditorium by the newly-elected Student Council. Since its first step toward the fulfillment of its election promises to abolish political combines in Student Government.

Amendments
The first amendments to be voted upon, both of which require a two-thirds vote of all those present at the convention, are as follows:
