Chanticleer Expected On Campus in April

Duke's yearbook, the Chanticleer, is due to be in the hands of students about the first week in April.

According to Editor Ann Heffner, this year's book is to be a different type edition than any heretofore printed at Duke. It is based on the same model of publication as that of Life magazine. The Chanticleer is divided into sections with campus organizations bearing a write-up about its activities.

The publication this year plans to have each organization publicized in the front of the book. The remaining 344 pages are entirely devoted to campus "shots" which have been collected through the year.

Tuition cost is \$100 per year for 3 years. This covers the cost of instruction and maintenance. Duke University School of Nursing offers the B.S. in Nursing upon completion of the 3-year nursing course and 60 semester hours of acceptable college credits.
