## ENLIST NOW WITH EMERGENCY PEACE VOLUNTEERS FOR SUMMER 1937

### QUALIFICATIONS

Volunteers must be physically strong, mentally alert, idealistic, and adventurous. They must exemplify the spirit of reconciliation and tolerance which is as necessary to peace as the spirit of intolerance is to war. They must be able to meet with courage and goodwill any criticism or opposition which might develop. They must be resourceful enough to adapt themselves to complex and changing local conditions. They must possess the initiative which will permit them to seek out the key peace-minded individuals of a community and with them develop the type of educational program necessary to fill the needs of that community. They must be alert to crystallize the developing peace sentiment into an effective weapon against war. Enlistment is open to young men and women of college age and older, without regard to race or creed.

### ARE YOU READY

To live under simple conditions comparable to those of a soldier? To bear your share of the menial tasks incidental to simple living?

To lead discussion groups? To organize peace demonstrations? To arrange exhibits? To produce plays? To sell literature? To contact newspapers? To organize peace councils?

To speak before churches, service clubs, young people's societies, labor groups, and farm organizations? To discover and help develop all potential peace forces in the community?

To help make the existing will to peace politically effective? To do all in your power to substitute peaceful processes for the war method?

### TRAINING

Before being sent into the field each group of young people will be given at least two weeks of intensive training under able leadership. Courses will be offered on the technique of field work and the most important aspects of the peace-war problem. Emergency Peace Volunteers will be encouraged to specialize in one or two aspects of the problem in addition to acquiring a general background.

### COSTS

Young people are called upon to sacrifice during a war, even to the extreme of life itself. Their parents are called upon to bear the cost of war through taxes and depression. The Emergency Peace Campaign calls upon individuals of foresight to give for peace now in order that war may be prevented. Each Volunteer must be responsible for a large share of the total expenses, which include transportation, training, maintenance in the field, administration costs, supervision, books, literature, etc. The total per Volunteer will be \$150.00. If the Volunteer or his parents cannot bear this cost, perhaps an organization or group may be able to do so. If necessary, the Emergency Peace Campaign will endeavor to cooperate with the Volunteer in raising such funds in his community.

### ENLISTMENT

Periods of enlistment will be for approximately ten weeks, six months, or longer. Groups will begin preliminary training the middle of June. Application blanks will be furnished by Emergency Peace Campaign field secretaries or upon request from national headquarters. If the applicant is accepted by the Personnel Committee, an enlistment card will be sent. Assignments to units and to territories will be made during the training period.
